Registration is open for the AP Summer Institute in Art & Design!

Converse University will host the AP Summer Institute in Art & Design in an online format, June 13 - 30, 2022.

The AP Art and Design Summer Institute is a combination of seminar sessions and hands-on studio activities that address the revitalization of the artist/researcher/teacher with an emphasis on contemporary art practice in the high school art room. Sessions include topics on the AP Art and Design program requirements and portfolio scoring for Drawing, 2-D Design, and 3-D Design submissions, as well as inspiration for developing curricula specific for the three portfolios: Drawing, 2-D Design, and 3-D Design.

The purpose of the Advanced Placement (AP) Teacher Institutes is to provide South Carolina public school teachers with the special endorsement to teach an AP course as required in S.C. Code Ann. Reg. 43-258.1 (2018). Teachers who successfully complete an AP teacher institute will be awarded special AP endorsement in the specific AP class area.

This grant-funded initiative is open to SC High School Art Teachers with priority for registration to teachers currently teaching AP Courses or those assigned to teach AP courses. Participants will also be enrolled in EDU 599.01: Advanced Placement Art and Design Institute for 3 graduate credit hours.
